

The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, April 30, 2025, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Clint Blackburn and Dustin Sheldon present. Let the record show that Jeff Shearer was not present for this meeting. A quorum was declared, and the meeting was officially called to order at 9:00 a.m. The agenda was approved as posted. Minutes of the previous board session were read and approved.

Let the record show that Engineer Dan Davis and Tandon VanScyoc were present at this meeting.

Engineer Dan Davis met with the board for the signing of the following:

Motion by Sheldon to allow Chairman Blackburn to sign an application for underground construction in ROW for Atchison-Holt Electric Cooperative to place underground cable in a duct from pole to transformer on L-44, one-quarter mile from Highway 2 north. Motion carried unanimously.

Davis stated that Noack with MidAmerican, has been in contact with Mortensen and the tabled item from last week should be back on the May 7 agenda.


The board discussed the wage for the new sanitarian. The last Sanitarian started at \$18.00 per hour. Motion by Sheldon to start the Sanitation position at \$18.00 and once training is complete increasing the wage to \$20.15. Motion carried unanimously.

During public comment, Tandon VanScyoc asked if the board was aware that signs have been placed saying "no construction traffic" but there have been pick-ups and trailers hauling skid loaders in the area where the signs are posted. Chairman Blackburn stated they need to get the project manager involved as they are the ones to be handling these concerns. It was discussed that Conner Nuss stated in the meeting a couple weeks ago that he was the project manager for Mortensen. Blackburn will work on getting contact information for him. VanScyoc also stated his road was closed and was not made aware that it was going to be closed. He felt they discussed a different road a couple weeks ago that was closing but not his. VanScyoc stated why put up signs if they aren't going to abide by them. Blackburn will follow up with VanScyoc once he gets information.

Claims were approved for May 2, 2025.

At 9:17 a.m., with no further business, Sheldon motioned to adjourn. The motion carried unanimously.
