

The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Tuesday, September 15, 2026, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Clint Blackburn and Jeff Shearer present. Let the record show that Sheldon was not present for this meeting. A quorum was declared, and the meeting was officially called to order at 9:07 a.m. Minutes of the previous board session were read and approved. The agenda was approved as posted.

Let the record show that Treasurer Alise Snyder and Maintenance Zach Benedict were present in the boardroom for this meeting.

The official canvass of the Shenandoah School Special Election on September 8, 2026, was held. There were 39 Fremont County residents who voted in this election. The PPEL vote passed with thirty-one "yes" votes, seven "no" votes, and one "undervote". Made a motion to approve the Fremont County results of the Shenandoah School Special Election. Motion carried unanimously.

Auditor Owen said she hadn't heard from the county attorney regarding whether the stipend for the Chief Deputy could be a motion or a resolution. Motion by Shearer to table the motion/resolution for the stipend for the Chief Deputy performing jail duties to wait for more guidance from the county attorney. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Shearer to approve the TIF reporting requirement to the Department of Management. Motion carried unanimously.

Zach Benedict, Maintenance, met with the board requesting approval of the annual Lawn World irrigation winterization and spring start-up contract. It also includes a reduction on service calls to \$65. The renewal contract is \$300.00. Motion by Shearer to approve the Lawn World irrigation contract. Motion carried unanimously.

The board discussed the abatement of taxes on a property now owned by the City of Sidney. The board agreed that if the city is selling the property, the back taxes should be paid as part of the sale. Motion by Shearer to table the tax abatement for the City of Sidney on Parcel #470470582000000 until they find out what the city plans to do with the property. Motion carried unanimously.

Claims were approved for September 18, 2026.

At 9:18 a.m., with no further business, Shearer motioned to adjourn. The motion carried unanimously.
