Engineer Dan Davis met with the board for the signing of the following:

Motion by Sheldon to allow Vice-Chairman Clark to sign agreement for engineering and surveying services for bridge replacement on 120th Street (J-18) over Walnut Creek. Motion carried unanimously.

The board discussed continuing health care coverage for the family of a deceased employee. The board discussed paying the full cost for family insurance for 3 months out of the department of the deceased employee's budget and then re-evaluating the situation. Motion by Sheldon to extend healthcare coverage for 90 days for the family of the employee for three months and then re-evaluate the situation. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Sheldon to allow Vice-Chairman Clark to sign final certificate of substantial completion for EN 4 East/West Nishnabotna Watershed Project. Motion carried unanimously.

Assistant Auditor Cassie Gilbert presented the board with the new and disallowed homestead and military claims for 2022 from the assessor. Motion made by Sheldon to approve the claims. Motion carried unanimously.

At 9:26 a.m., motion by Sheldon to go into recess before the public hearing. Motion carried unanimously. At 9:30 a.m., motion by Sheldon to go back into session. Motion carried unanimously.

At 9:31 a.m., Clark moved to go into public hearing on the petition for establishment of a levee district in the area of the Highway 2/1-29 Corridor. Motion carried unanimously. Present for this hearing were Vice- Chairman Chris Clark, Supervisor Dustin Sheldon, Assistant County Attorney Ryan Dale, Treasurer Alise Snyder, EMC Mike Crecelius, Auditor Dee Owen, Maureen Collins, Liz Skillern, Jim Olmstead, Attorney Matt Woods, Dennis and Janice Holliman, Les Robbins, Leonard Tomlyn, Kelly Wise, Kevin Kruse, Neal Everist, Tyler Marsh, and Andrew Richard. Jeremy Voorhees with Iowa Department of Transportation was present by telephone. Jim Olmstead from Olmstead and Perry spoke regarding the engineering study. He stated that the idea is to provide protection to businesses at the corridor and also to the Iowa Department of Transportation. Neal Everist asked questions of Olmstead regarding the height of the levee, if there would be a survey and the overall budget. Olmstead stated that the height would vary from 4' to 6.5' depending on elevation. He discussed that the IDOT was going to contribute \$2.868 million dollars for the project, but after revisions that they board asked for the project could be \$3 to \$3.5 million. Leonard Tomlyn stated that the three culverts the IDOT is putting in will not take care of the water over there. He stated they need at least six. Olmstead said that the IDOT did an engineering study there and deemed them appropriate. At 9:41 a.m., Pat Sheldon joined the meeting. Maureen Collins asked about countermeasures to keep traffic flowing. Olmstead stated there will be flap gates to keep water from flowing back into the area. He said it would be possible that there may have to pumps brought in at some time to pump water out. The idea is just to mitigate the flooding to protect Highway 2 and the businesses. Dennis and Janice Holliman stated that as the map is designed now their field drive is in the middle of the levee leaving them without access to their field. It was asked if when the project was going if they could include a field drive on the south end of their property. Holliman's also spoke about this design limiting future development on their property and asked why the business to the south of them was not in it. It was explained that the business probably didn't sign the petition. Kevin Kruse stated that he had an objection. The first drawing presented was not going to but his biggest field in half. He hadn't had any communication since the first map until he got the public hearing notice. He was opposed to the changes requested by the board. Supervisor Sheldon explained that they made that change to keep the levee from taking a hard right angle on the north end. It was suggested that Sheldon, Kruse and others sit down with the engineer to come up with solutions. IDOT Jeremy Voorhees briefly discussed that DOT is working on projects to keep both Highway 2 and I-29 open if there is a future flood event. Les Robbins spoke in support of the project. In his opinion, the benefits outweigh the negatives. If the area is protected more business will be apt to locate there. Robbins apologized to Kruse and stated he thought he emailed him the new design. Andy Richard and Tyler Marsh with Sapp Bros stated that we need to try something, they don't want the road raised as it would create an issue of how people would exit into those businesses. Marsh said they know that they are not removing risk just mitigating it. Sheldon reiterated as in previous meetings that he does not want the district to eventually be turned over to the board of supervisors. Other topics discussed were seep water, gas tanks, velocity changes in the water, and changes being made in the Missouri River to mitigate the water flow. After much discussion, motion at 10:30 a.m. by Sheldon to close the public hearing. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Clark to table the vote on the proposed district until Chairman Hickey was present and the landowners' concerns were considered. Motion carried unanimously. Attorney Woods suggested the date of September 24th to consider the matter again.

Claims were approved for August 19, 2022.
