Auditor Owen pointed out that is the case with several of the properties in the buyout program. Treasurer Alise Snyder explained that other counties have let the properties go to tax sale. That does not change ownership of the property. That process takes well over 2 years. The property could still go to tax sale and the buyout program can reimburse the county for the certificate. Both Clerk Owen and Fleener agreed that this was the best option.
